Should the Town of Mendon purchase St. Michael's Church for the Taft Public Library?

Why invest in a library AT ALL??

To Support <u>INCREASING</u> Demand	 Libraries are in more demand than ever. Visits to the Taft Library increased by 107% from 2006-2010. Last year, over 3,400 children and adults participated in 146 programs. 40+% of residents have library cards.
"Why have a library building when we have the Internet now?"	 The library offers free e-books for download at home. The number of books borrowed and the number of visits to libraries have increased nationally and locally, right along with the growth of the Internet and e-books.
"What else does the library offer besides books?"	 Free access to computers, the Internet, and space for adults to meet and work. Saves everyone money by providing free e-books, video games, DVDs, CDs, magazines, newspapers. Dozens of programs - from children's story times to individual tutorials on how to use the Internet, as well as providing print and e-books, digital databases, etc. It turns people into readers and thinkers with a love for learning, beginning at a young age and continuing throughout their lives.

Why do we need a new building? Our current building lacks:

Space for Programming	 Many programs are held off-site or must be declined. Children's programs are now held in the aisles. No outdoor space for children's programming.
Space for Books, Movies, Music, Periodicals	 Some books now stored in the old Fire Station. Children cannot reach many of the bookshelves.
Space for Quiet Study	Young adults especially need quiet study space.
Space for Computer Use	 An increasingly popular service is currently available to just a few patrons.

Space for Meeting and Events	 Needed for book clubs, community groups or events, presentations, students, staff, trustees.
Space for Staff	 All staff share one tiny office with no work table. Overcrowded office also serves as supply closet.
ADA Compliance	 Many of our seniors and disabled neighbors cannot get into the building or access both levels once inside. One small, inaccessible bathroom in the entire building. Current building cannot be brought within code.

What will it cost?

What is the purchase price?	\$360,000. That's \$13/ yr for the average home.
What is the cost of renovation?	A maximum of \$1,700,000 that will be reduced with grants and collaborations with community partners. That's a maximum of \$59/yr for the average home. More information to follow.
How is it to be funded?	A 20-year debt exclusion. This is not a permanent tax increase.
What is the size of the new space?	6,000 square feet. Our current building has 2,000 square feet.
Won't this mean an increase in operating costs?	Only for utilities, maintenance and plowing – a small portion of the budget. Staffing will not increase.
Why can't we get funding from the MA Library Board of Commissioners (MLBC)?	We might get funding after going through a long process with a waiting list. The library would be much larger, and the cost to taxpayers would still be higher.
What would it cost to build a new library on land the town owns?	\$4 million for a building similar in size to St. Michael's Church.

	Plenty of space for outdoor programming.
	 Good condition – new roof, septic.
	Nothing else in town fits the bill.
